

QUALITATIVE ANALYSIS:

Webinar for Teen Pregnancy Prevention 2018 Grantees

Monday, March 9, 2020

Webinar summary

Overview

The qualitative analysis webinar was intended for grantees who plan to analyze qualitative data for their journal articles or use these data as part of their CQI processes. We described the purpose of qualitative analysis and the steps to conduct these analyses. This included a discussion of how to prepare data for analysis, develop a coding system, identify key findings from coded data, and report results. The webinar also focused on the possibilities that qualitative analysis offers, as well as some of the limitations and key considerations.

Feedback from grantees

In total, 20 grantee staff attended the webinar. Twelve grantee staff represented 7 of the 14 TPP18 Tier 2 Phase 1 grantees. Staff from TPP15 Tier 2b grants were also invited to attend the webinar. Eight grantee staff represented six of the 19 TPP15 Tier 2b grantees. Appendix A provides the full attendee list from the webinar. We administered module 2 of the feedback survey to gather input from the grantees on the quality of the webinar. We administered module 2 of the feedback survey to gather input from the grantees on the quality of the webinar. We received three responses across eight grantees. The response rate for the survey was approximately 15% of webinar attendees. In addition, we received anecdotal feedback from grantees on subsequent calls that the content of the webinar was helpful.

Closed ended questions

Figure 1 shows the grantees' responses to the closed-ended questions. The respondents provided positive feedback for the webinar. All respondents agreed or strongly agreed on seven of the nine questions. In particular, respondents strongly agreed that the webinar increased their capacity to use research or effectively incorporate data into decision making and that the benefits of the webinar were worth the time invested.

Most helpful aspects

One participant responded to this question and indicated that the entire presentation was helpful.

Least helpful aspects

One participant responded to this question but didn't highlight any aspect that was unhelpful. He or she is new to learning qualitative analysis, so the information presented was helpful.

Additional information, support, tools, or activities

No participants responded to this question.

Suggestions for improvement

No participants responded to this question.

Action steps

One respondent noted that he or she will apply the information to an upcoming project to present qualitative data at a Fall 2020 conference.

Pressing needs

No participants responded to this question.

Areas of TA

For this question, grantees were able to select more than one area of TA. One respondent answered this question and indicated that tracking and retention was an area of need for TA.
